Canon Law: Introduction to Canon Law and Marriage Law	CL 501 CRN 125	3	Introductory	<i>K. Laverone</i> Th 8:00-11AM	This course is divided into parts: Introduction to Canon Law and Marriage Law. Throughout the entire course the emphasis will be on the pastoral application of law to ministerial situations. Balanced pastoral application of Law presumes healthy comprehension of the essential concepts underpinning the legal norms and wise weighing of the facts in a particular case.

Freyer</i> W 6:00-9PM	Following the Christologies of the New Testament and the Credo of the great ecumenical Councils of the first centuries, this course will consider some of the important traditional Christologies. Looking to the central components of the classic and modern Christologies, the course will emphasize the Franciscan Tradition from Alexander of Hales to Bonaventure and John Duns Scotus regarding the theological disputation of "Cur Deus Homo? (Why God becomes Human?)" with regards to today's challenge of globalization, secularization, and multiculturalism.

Day</i> Th 6:00-9PM	This course outlines the basic structure and method of Roman Catholic moral theology, with a particular emphasis on the Franciscan moral vision. By means of common readings, discussion, and lectures, it introduces basic concepts of moral theology and moral methods from a Franciscan perspective.
History of Christianity	HS 501 CRN 104	3	Introductory	<i>D. Pryds</i> M 6:00-9PM	This introductory class offers an overview of the development of Christianity from its beginnings to the present. In addition, this course offers fundamental research skills that support graduate level study. Students must have access to Blackboard.

The student is introduced to the basic content, structure, and motifs of the NT writings; the theory and practice of major integrative methodologies; the hermeneutical and other critical issues of modern biblical studies; the resources for understanding, preaching and teaching the NT.

Short</i> Tu 1:00-4PM	A careful reading of the complete writings of Francis and Clare of Assisi, exploring their Gospel form of life, the bases of Franciscan spirituality; images of God, Christ, Church, and the human person. All texts available in English translation. No previous study of Franciscan sources necessary.
